1. Schedule of Races

Friday	12 April 2019	14h00 First Warning Signal – 1 medium distance race, or up to 3 short course races scheduled
Saturday	13 April 2019	10h00 First Warning Signal – 3 races scheduled
Sunday	14 April 2019	10h00 First Warning Signal – 3 races scheduled
		No warning signal after 15h00 on Sunday 14 April 2019

2. Location of the Race Office, Protest Room, Official Notice Board and Flag Pole on shore

- 2.1. The Race Office is located on the Ground Floor of the HBYC Clubhouse.
- 2.2. The Protest Room is located next to the Race Office on the Ground Floor of the HBYC Clubhouse.
- 2.3. The Official Notice Board is located near the top of the stairway on the First Floor of the HBYC Clubhouse.
- 2.4. The flagpole for signals made ashore is a mast located in front of the Clubhouse, alongside the eastern side of the balcony.

3. List of Marks

- 3.1. The following marks/rounding points may be used but is not limited to:
 - a) Large Red Inflatable Marks
 - b) Vulcan Rock
 - c) Swell/Weather Buoy (south of crayfish factory)
 - d) Barker Rock
 - e) HBYC Permanent mark "Dunes"
 - f) HBYC Permanent mark "Ore Jetty"
 - g) HBYC Permanent mark "Fish on the Rocks"

4. Class Flags

- 4.1. The class flags will be a white flag bearing the ORC insignia, and a numeral pennant for each class to be defined based on entries received per NoR clause 3. Final class splits and flags will be posted at registration.

5. Additional Courses

- 5.1. Additional courses may be defined by the Race Committee on the water, using any combination of marks, and will be communicated on VHF71 and/or on WhatsApp. This changes RRS 90.2(c).

6. Time Limits

- 6.1. Mark 1 Time Limit for the first boat in each class to pass mark 1:
 - a) 30 minutes for short courses
 - b) No limit for medium distance courses
- 6.2. Race Time Limit for the first boat in each class to sail the course and finish:
 - a) 2 hours for short courses
 - b) No limit for medium distance courses
- 6.3. Finishing Window Time Limit for boats to finish after the first boat sails the course and finishes:
 - a) Finishing Window Time Limit is the elapsed time of the first boat that sails the course and finishes, divided by the GPH of the fastest boat in class, multiplied by the GPH of the slowest boat in the class, multiplied by 1.4
 - b) Boats failing to finish within Finishing Window Time Limit after the first boat sails the course and finishes, shall be scored with the number of points equal to the number of boats that have started and finished within the time limit, plus 1. This changes RRS 35 and A4.
